Submission and Selection of Abstracts: Please submit abstracts to blumcenter@ucla.edu by **March 3rd, 2014**. Abstracts should be no longer than 250 words and should include all of the major elements of your paper, including an introduction, hypothesis, methods, preliminary results, and discussion. Abstracts will be reviewed and selected by the UCLA Blum Center. If your abstract is selected, you will be notified via email.

About the Spring Conference: The UCLA Blum Center Second Annual Spring Conference will be held on May 6th and 7th, 2014. The conference is designed to advance knowledge on policy solutions aimed at creating more equitable health in Latin America. This collaborative event will feature panel discussions and dialogue prepared by US and Latin American-based faculty, researchers, health care providers, and policy makers across disciplines and other experts in the field that address emerging and unsolved issues related to poverty and health in Latin America. The conference will provide opportunities for education and multidisciplinary collaboration among students, faculty, community members, and international partners. The theme for the symposium is: **Connecting International Partners to Strengthen Health Systems and Eliminate Health Disparities.**
