University of California seeds \$1.32 million for Blum Center coalition

On Monday, the UC Office of the President announced \$1.32 million in seed funding that will create a universitywide coalition in hopes of mobilizing the next generation of students in the fight against global poverty.

The Blum Federation — an alliance of nine UC Blum Centers — will be offering new programs, such as an expanding poverty studies minor and the creation of a cross-campus student fellowship program, according to a UC press release.

Founded nearly a decade ago, UC Berkeley's Blum Center - the first of nine across the UC system, financed with support from UC Regent Richard Blum ready been created in part-students to integrate their own news editor.
